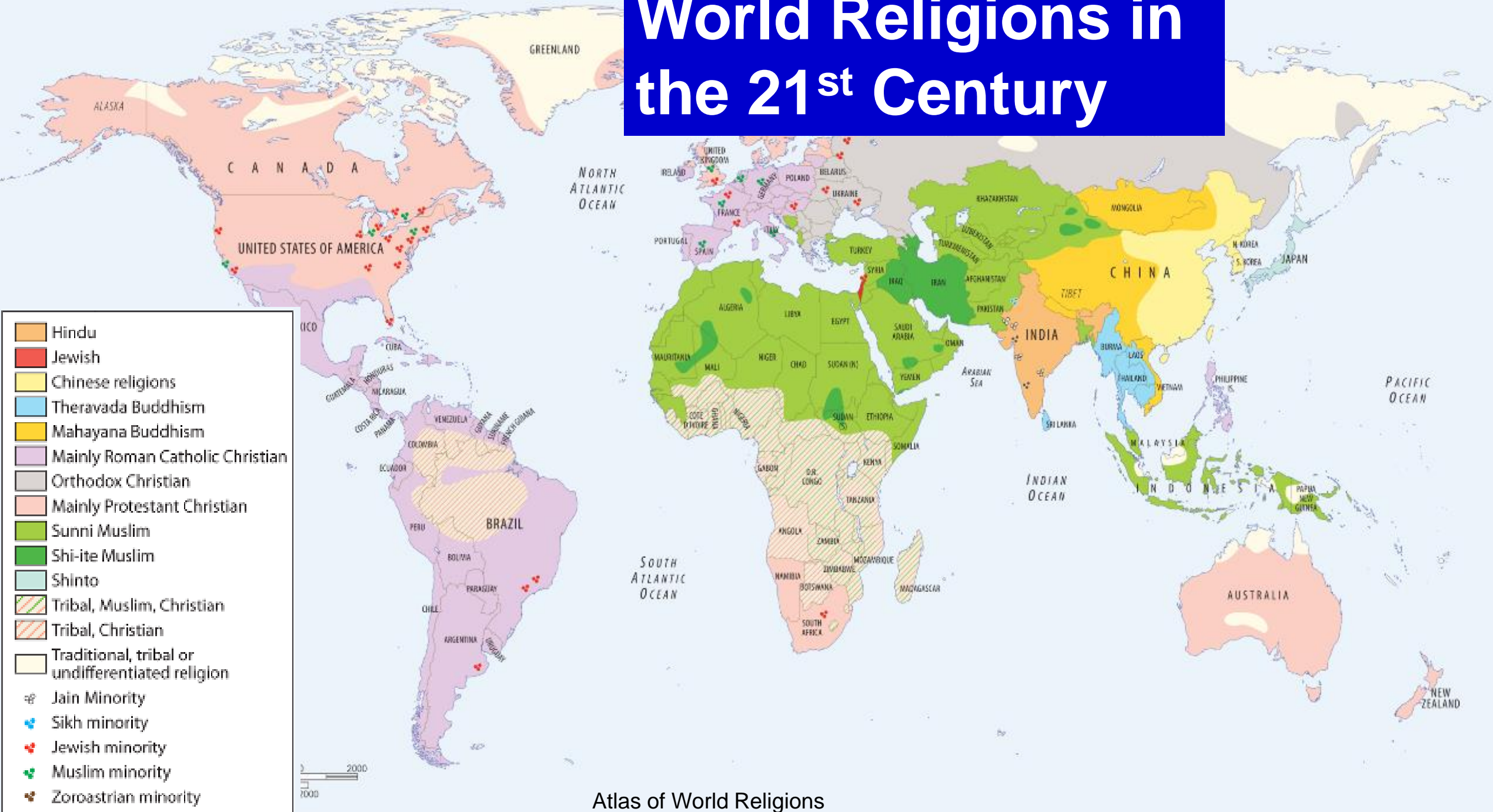
Romans 10:13-15

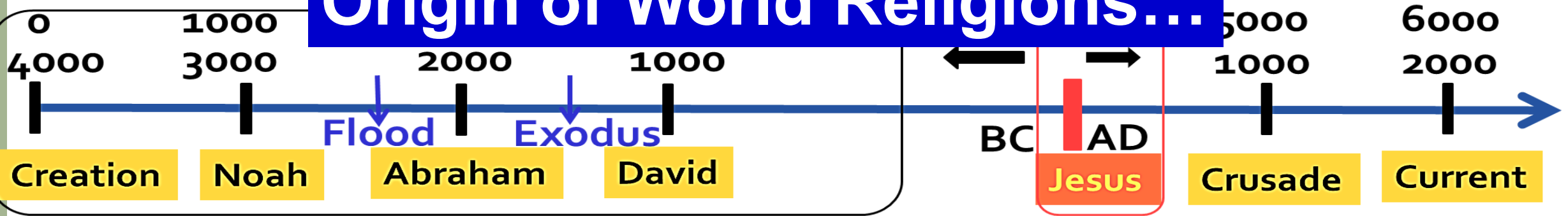

“In Uruk... dating to c. 3000 BC... there were two main temples... Anu, the supreme god, the king of heaven;... Inanna, the great mother, goddess of fertility, love, and war...”

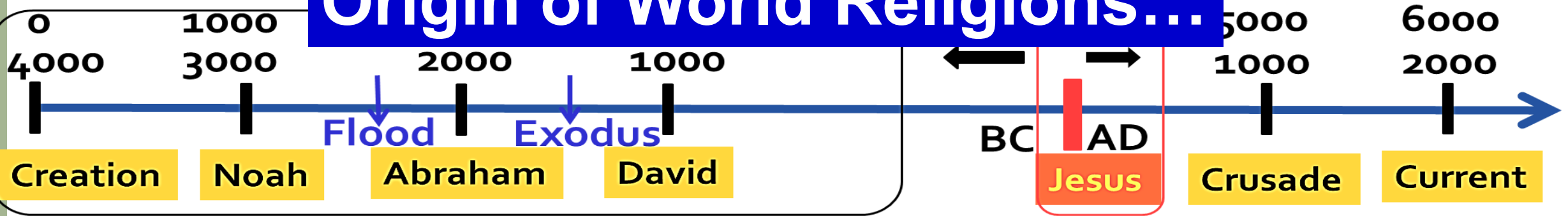
Egyptian gods

“Ancient Egypt...from about 3100 BC... little known about actual Egyptian religious beliefs... gods represented powerful natural forces.. the sun... the annual flooding of the Nile...”

Hinduism

“may be... as old as Indian civilization itself. Archaeological evidence suggests continuities between the religion of the Indus Valley society of 2500-1500 BC...”

Emergence of Religion

Zoroasterianism
is the westernized version of 'Zarathushtra', the prophet of ancient Persia, who may have lived c. 1200 BC, when Persia was emerging..."

Buddhism
"an English name for a religion often called by its adherents the Dharma, meaning 'the teaching' & 'the way things are'... named after the Buddha... born in 563 BC"

Confucianism
"... represented by the thinkers Confucius (551BC), Mencius(371BC). .. primary emphasis to the ethical meaning of human relationships"

Islam
"According to the traditional account, the Islamic prophet Muhammad began receiving what Muslims consider to be divine revelations in 610 AD..."

Different Practices on Infanticide

Greco-Roman Culture

“Once approved by many pagan philosophers, practiced long before & after Christianity entered”

Other Cultures

“Once approved & practiced in the pagan societies of China, India, Japan, Brazil, American Indians, Eskimos, African tribes and others”

Christianity

“Condemned by Christians whose influence prompted Roman emperors to outlaw infanticide in the middle 4th century”

The Role and Status of Women

Non-Christian Practices (Past or Present)	Christian Practices (Past or Present)
Athenian wife was confined to her quarters when men guests were present	Women (Mary and Martha) hosted Jesus in their home
Female babies valued less than male babies	Female and male babies valued equally
Suttee (sati): Hindus burning husband's widow in India; practiced for many centuries	Banned in India by the British under Christian influence in 1829
Foot binding of young girls: once common in China for centuries	Christian influence led to China's outlawing female foot binding in 1912

Early Evangelist: St Patrick

“Ireland’s great fifth-century missionary”



“born into a Christian family in the Roman province of Britain (~AD 389) ... in his mid-teens, his town... was invaded by... Irish plunderers... Patrick were carried away... as slaves...”

“He later returned home... in his Confession, God called him “in the depth of the night... heard the voice... ‘Please, holy boy, come and walk among us again.’ Their cry pierced to my very heart, and I could read no more; and so I awoke.”

Early Evangelist: St Patrick



“Following this call, Patrick trained for ministry at the church... in Gaul... past age forty... arrived in Ireland in 432... described the region as “the very ends of the earth”... They worshipped the sun, moon, wind... believed in good & evil spirits...”

“...the king’s brother became a convert and granted Patrick land for a church... by 447, after 15 years of preaching, much of Ireland had been evangelized... Patrick was recognized all over Ireland as a great man of God...”

Late Evangelist: Lottie Moon



- **Born in 1840, in Albemarle County, VA**
- **Rebelled against Christianity until she was in college.**
- **In 1858, dedicated her life to Christ**
- **Edmonia Moon, Lottie's sister, was appointed to Tengchow, China, in 1872. Next year, Lottie joined her, served 39 years as a missionary**
- **When she went for China, Lottie was 32 years old. left her job, home and family to follow God's lead.**

Late Evangelist: Lottie Moon



- Taught in a girls' school and often made trips into China's interior to share gospel.
- Local people feared & rejected her, but she refused to leave.
- The aroma of fresh-baked cookies drew people to her house.
- She adopted traditional Chinese dress
- Learned China's language and customs.
- helping lay the foundation of modern Chinese church
- died at 72

Evangelism in Korea

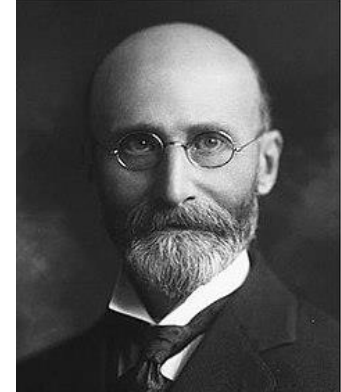
“Korea was known as the “Hermit Kingdom”... few Americans knew anything about Korea prior to 1880... Korea is one of the few areas of the world where virtually all of the pioneer 19th century missionaries were Americans.”

**“an American Methodist Episcopal Church missionary.
her son was appointed to the Methodist Medical Mission in Korea in 1884... she become the first female missionary in Korea, founded the Ewha Girls School”**

**Horace N. Allen
(1858-1932)**



“a medical missionary of the Northern Presbyterian Church. went to Korea in 1884, Established Gwanghyewon, which became Yonsei University Medical School (1885)”
